**Jerome Davis (Artistic Director/Producer)**. For Burning Coal: A Little Night Music, Arcadia, etc. For other companies: Turn of the Screw (NC Opera), Red (Lexington Theatre Guild), etc. Jerry founded Burning Coal too many years ago to count. He has worked with Ellyn Burstyn, Richard Jenkins, David Edgar, Ralph Waite, Lindsey Crouse and David Wheeler, among others.

Johannah Maynard Edwards (Director: Through the Years, To be Deceased) is the Executive Artistic Director of the National Women's Theatre Festival based in Raleigh, NC. She has directed, devised, and produced in NYC, Minneapolis, and the Triangle. Johannah is currently co-creating, directing, and devising The Momversations Project production and podcast. Other recent directing credits include Dance Nation, readings of Out Of Balance by Lindsay Carpenter, Natural Shocks by Lauren Gunderson (both WTF) and You Are What You by Mora V. Harris (Burning Coal) as well as productions of Space Girl by Mora V. Harris (Longleaf School of the Arts) and her original devised work Licked Cupcake (WTF). Recent performance credits include Gertie And Alice By The Sea (Gertie) by Caridad Svich and Alabaster (June) by Audrey Cefaly. Her short form video performance 200 Days In was commissioned by the Raleigh Arts Commission's SEEK Raleigh program. A passionate arts educator, Johannah has been a teaching artist at Raleigh Little Theatre, Arts Together, Sterling Montessori, LearningSpring, NC Governor's School, and at Longleaf School of the Arts. Johannah is a Chief Rep for PAAL, the Parent Artist Advocacy League for the Performing Arts and proudly served on the Arts Learning Community for Universal Access through the Office of Raleigh Arts for 3 years. She has also served on the SETC Equity Diversity Inclusion + Access Task Force and as the Founding Chair of the SETC Disability Inclusion Committee, and the Kennedy Center Leadership Exchange in Arts and Disability (LEAD®) Conference Content Committee. In 2022, Johannah received the LEAD® Award for Emerging Leaders from the Kennedy Center. Johannah is a graduate of NYU/Tisch School of the Arts/Playwrights Horizons Theatre School.

Susan made her Off-Broadway debut in the New York premiere of Christopher Durang's The Vietnamization of New Jersey and performed on stage at Theatre Row, The Brick, Dixon Place, and Teatro LATEA.
