

Synopsis:

Rebellion is nigh in Matilda JR., a gleefully witty ode to the the anarchy of childhood and the power of imagination! This story of a girl who dreams of a better life and the children she inspires will have audiences rooting for the "revolting children" who are out to teach the grown-ups a lesson.

Matilda has astonishing wit, intelligence... and special powers! She's unloved by her cruel parents but impresses her schoolteacher, the highly loveable Miss Honey. Matilda's school life isn't completely smooth sailing, however – the school's mean headmistress, Miss Trunchbull, hates children and just loves thinking up new punishments for those who don't abide by her rules. But Matilda has courage and cleverness in equal amounts, and could be the school pupils' saving grace!

Director's Note:

"Somewhere inside all of us is the power to change the world." Roald Dahl wrote those words for Matilda in his 1988 children's book. It's the story of an underdog, up against the headmistress Agatha Trunchbull - the most powerful person in her world - and born to parents who do not recognize her value. Instead of bowing to the circumstances she is born into, Matilda chooses to do what she can to make the world better in her own mischievous way. What unfolds is civil disobedience in its most intuitive form. The stories she reads, and subsequently her own story, is filled with the strength and magic of peaceful resistance. Injustices are handed down from those on top, but that doesn't mean we "have to take it on the chin and wear it." The story of these children is a reminder we are born courageous. Insecurity and nervousness are learned behaviors, but they can be unlearned with practice. Let's all take a cue from Matilda.


Alastor Morse (Escapologist/Ensemble)
