

Burning Coal believes that every student has a story to tell. Through playwriting and improvisation exercises, students are encouraged to explore their own story, creating and performing new material based on their lives, their interests, and their concerns.

STC Jr. will culminate in a production of Blank Canvas, an original play which will be written by the students themselves. The Sr. class will display their theatrical skills with a production of Shakespeare's Much Ado About Nothing, a romantic comedy full of revenge, trickery, and weddings.
